Dual MAcCHM/DAcCHM Application Document Checklist

Important: All documents submitted to UEWM as part of the application become the property of the University. This is a common practice among schools in the U.S. Students should always request more than two sets of their transcripts for other future needs.

Dual MAcCHM/DAcCHM Applicants Must Meet All Following Requirements:

1. Applicants must have satisfactorily completed **at least three (3) years of undergraduate-level education (defined as 90 semester credits or 135 quarter credits)** from an institution accredited or pre-accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education. In considering the acceptance of education and training obtained in foreign countries, credits earned at a foreign educational institution must be validated by a recognized educational credentials evaluation service.
2. **A maximum of 30 semester credits** of the prerequisite three-year education requirement may be earned through successful testing assessment using a combination of acceptable assessment modalities such as: College Advanced Placement (AP), College Level Examination Programs (CLEP), American College Testing Proficiency Program (ACT/PEP), and U.S. Armed Forces Institute Programs (USAFI). Although you may be awarded credit for these testing assessments, some state licensing agencies may not accept these credits if they were awarded by non-regionally accredited institutions.
3. All applicants must have a prior **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.0 minimum.**
4. **Proof of California Residency** (See below for details.)
5. **English Language Proficiency Evaluation** (See below for details.)

The Dual MAcCHM/DAcCHM degree program does not accept international students.

The University only issues Form I-20 for the MAcCHM degree program.

All documents are required to be in English and submitted within 2 weeks prior to the start of the semester or within 2 weeks of your application, with the exception of the Foreign Official Transcript which should be submitted no later than the end of the first semester.

- ☐ *Official Transcript(s): In your native language and English or in English only; and foreign transcript evaluation report: need(s) to be submitted no later than the end of the first semester.
- ☐ *Official TCM Master's Degree Transcript(s): In your native language and English or in English only; and foreign transcript evaluation report: need(s) to be submitted no later than the end of the first semester.
- ☐ Proof of California Residency (e.g. California Driver's License, or California REAL ID, or California Voter Registration, or Rental Agreement showing a California physical address, or Affidavit from a landlord verifying a California physical address and length of tenancy)
- ☐ Digital Photo (with white background, similar to a passport photo)
- ☐ Current Resume
- ☐ Two Letters of Recommendation (Form is available online.) (No medical background is required for the writers.)
- ☐ 500-Word Statement of Purpose to study TCM
- ☐ **English Language Proficiency Requirement (For students whose native language is not English and whose prior education was not conducted in English.)
- ☐ Signed Student Enrollment Agreement Packet (when a student registers for classes)

* Important Transcript Submission Information

- *Official transcripts* must be submitted in the original envelopes in which they were sent or emailed directly from the educational institution to our Admissions Office.
- Transcripts from colleges/universities outside the U.S. must be evaluated by an U.S.-based official evaluation organization that is NACES Certified, for:



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1. Credential equivalency
 2. Course-by-course evaluation
 3. GPA.

** English Language Proficiency Requirement

1	Applicants not required to provide proof of English proficiency (any one items listed below)
	Native language is English.
	four years at a U.S. high school demonstrably delivered in English
	at least two-years (60 semester credits or 90 quarter credits) of undergraduate- or graduate-level education in an institution accredited by an agency recognized by the USDE
	at least two-years (60 semester credits or 90 quarter credits) of undergraduate- or graduate-level education demonstrably delivered in English
	high school or two-years (60 semester credits or 90 quarter credits) of undergraduate- or graduate-level education in an institution in one of the recognized countries or territories
	* In all cases, English must have been both the language of instruction and the language of the curriculum used.

2	An applicant who does not meet any of the criteria listed above, but meets any of the following criteria, only needs to pass UEWM's English proficiency test.
	Can also choose to provide a passing TOEFL (or equivalent) score record.
	is a US citizen
	is lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the US
	provides evidence from the Immigration and Naturalization Service that he or she is in the US for other than temporary purposes with the intention of becoming a citizen of, or lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the US
